**Welcome**

**Minutes of last meeting** on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> March 2022. No amendments suggested.

**Matters Arising**

1. Set format for posters and posts on social media. This has proven to be more complex than Graham first thought. Photos need to be a certain standard and good quality
2. Storage of documents - storage on Graham's computer hard drive and his personal Google My Drive account. Photos filed in folders under the contributor's name. Currently access is by the secretary only.
3. Mayo Branch annual report - Graham had sent in copies of our AGM minutes, our treasurer's report and our summary of outings to Birdwatch Ireland.
4. **Funding** -no changes since last meeting.

5. **Branch Hide** The Galway branch have a hide near Tuam. There are a couple in Mayo but they have problems with design, site and maintenance. Pádraig said that there is an excellent hide at Moate. Suggestion to contact Galway branch regarding their hide.

Indoor events are a means for raising branch funds provided the overheads are low. Graham said that he had attended two talks in Sligo involving eminent speakers, Sean Ronayne (Birdsong) and Jim Wilson. Both of these were in large hotel venues with excellent AV equipment and they were funded by the county council and university respectively with collaboration of the Sligo branch of BirdWatch Ireland in the organisation. The committee agreed that we should try to develop similar links.

Most talks in the Sligo branch are done by their members. Nathy was asked if he could speak on his India wildlife trip and he suggested maybe John Lusby could speak on bird ringing.

Discussion followed on potential venues and topics.

The vacancy for a “research officer” remains. Graham said that he receives occasional requests regarding the identification of birds, bird surveys and birding sites in Mayo. To assist in this an expert birdwatcher with excellent local knowledge and ideally one involved with surveys would be beneficial to the administration of our branch. Graham had received an expression of interest but she did not fulfil those criteria and had not confirmed that she was a member of BirdWatch Ireland. He would speak with John Milroy about his IWeBS team as one of them might be able to take on this role.
